### **George Walters Is Found Dead**

The body of George (Foxy) Walters, 64, 936 12th street, was found early this afternoon hanging in a building at the rear of his home. He was believed to have hanged himself with a rope at about 12:30 this noon. Coroner Herman A. Stuessy, who investigated with Police Chief J. H. Schwaiger, termed the death suicide.

The deceased, a son of Samuel and Lucinda Booher Walters, was born in Monticello and received his schooling there.

He was married in September, 1913, to Eva Burrington in Freeport. Upon moving to Monroe he was engaged in the harness-making trade. He was remarried on Sept. 16, 1922, to Lena Westgard in Freeport.

Surviving are his wife, the former Mrs. Mary Bradley, whom he married Aug. 24, 1946, a foster sister, Mrs. Mabel Wells, Monroe, and several cousins. He was preceded in death by his parents and his first and second wives.

Funeral services will be held at 2 Saturday afternoon at the Stuessy funeral home, Rev. Newell Mendenhall of Grace Lutheran church officiating. Burial will be in Monticello cemetery.
