July 8, 1865 – February 27, 1947

Rites Held for Mrs. Anna Weissmiller, Former Local Lady Esteemed Former Citizen Of Monticello Expires Thursday

Funeral services for Mrs. Anna Weissmiller, 81 years of age, highly esteemed resident of Monticello for many years, who passed away at Monroe Thursday following a long illness, were conducted at 2 Saturday afternoon in the Voegeli funeral home here.

The Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, pastor of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were: John Loertscher, Otto Theiler, Christ Yaussi, Albert Knobel, Fred Stauffer and Jacob Stauffer.

Native of Missouri

Anna Bieri was a native of Missouri, having been born in St Louis, July 8, 1865, the daughter of Jacob and Angeline Merrill Bieri. When she was but six weeks old, she made the long trip from Missouri to Wisconsin with her parents, who were among the early settlers of Washington township. On Nov. 20, 1884, she was united in marriage to Albert Weissmiller, the ceremony taking place in New Glarus. They farmed in Washington township for over 30 years, moving to Monticello to make their home in 1917. Mr. Weissmiller passed away here in 1936 and a few years later Mrs. Weissmiller went to Monroe to make her home after her health began to fail.

Mrs. Weissmiller was a member of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church.

News of Mrs. Weissmiller's passing was received with sincere regret by her many friends here, A kindly and soft spoken lady, she acquired a great many friends. both here and elsewhere because of her friendly and sincere nature.

Survivors include a daughter, Mrs. W. C. Baumgartner, Monroe; two sons, Albert C., Monticello, and Dr, Lester L., Madison; two brothers, William and Jacob Bieri, Covington, La.; a sister, Mrs. Emily Gilbert, New Orleans, La.; six grandchildren, and eight great-grandchildren.
