

## **Anetta Werder**

**Dec. 20, 1890 – Sept. 14, 1962**

### **Mrs, Anetta Werder, Area Native, Called**

Word has been received by Mrs. Jake Schultz and Mrs. Stillman Huntley of the death of a cousin, Mrs. Anetta C. Werder, which occurred at her home in Highland, Ill., Sept. 14. A heart attack was the cause of death at the age of 71 years.

Funeral services were held on Monday, Sept. 17, at the Evangelical and Reformed church at Highland and burial was in the Highland city cemetery.

Anetta Halder was born near Postville, Wis., on Dec. 20, 1890, the daughter of August and Elizabeth Brunner Halder. The family later moved to the Wittenwyler & Babler cheese factory, two miles south of Monticello, where Mr. Halder was the cheesemaker. In 1901 the family moved to Highland, Ill. On Aug. 21, 1914, she was married to Jacob Werder, who also settled in the Monticello area after coming to America from Switzerland.

Mr. and Mrs. Werder had always farmed near Highland. Mr. Werder died in 1958.

Mrs. Werder is survived by a son, Jake A. Werder; a daughter, Mrs. Ruby E. Tracy, Highland; eight grandchildren; a brother, Albert H. Halder, Highland; and three sisters, Mrs. Ed. Steinkoenig, Mrs. John Lorenz, Highland, Ill., and Mrs. Burnett Halder, Evansville, Wis.

She was preceded in death by her parents, three sisters, two brothers and a son.
