

Alfred F. Wettach
Aug. 23, 1888 - Dec. 8, 1973

Alfred F. Wettach, 85, Monticello, died unexpectedly about 6:15 p.m. Saturday, Dec. 8, in the New Glarus Home, shortly after returning to his room from the dining area. He had been at the New Glarus Home since last June 14.

Mr. Wettach was born in Trogen, Canton Appenzell, Switzerland, Aug. 23, 1888, a son of Jakob and Albertine Koch Wettach. He attended schools in Switzerland and came to the United States in 1908. He served in the U. S. Army during World War I as a private in Co. D, 331st Machine Gun Battalion.

He returned to Switzerland in 1919 and on Feb. 17, 1920, was married there to Babette Loppacher. Coming to America, they farmed in the Monticello area, moving into the village in 1947. Mrs. Wettach died July 2, 1961.

Mr. Wettach was a member of Zwingli United Church of Christ and of Amstutz-Marty American Legion Post of Monticello.

Surviving are two sons, Jacob A., Rt. 1, Belleville, and John, Rt. 1, Monticello; a daughter, Mrs. Robert J. (Rose) Coffey, Madison; a sister, Mrs. Emil (Marie) Frehner, Monroe; a brother, Jakob, Switzerland, and five grandchildren.

His parents and a brother died in Switzerland.

Funeral services will be at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 12, in Zwingli Church, Monticello, with Rev. Charles G. Workman officiating. Burial is to be in Highland Cemetery.
