THOUGHT PISTOL EMPTY; SHOT HIS COMPANION,

**Albert Wisenberg Dies Almost Instantly from Bullet Fired by Friend— Jury Says
“Accidental.”**

Monroe, Wis., May 24.—Fritz Wichser, a young man of the town of Washington, while out shooting with a revolver, accidentally shot and killed his friend, Albert Wisenberg. They were on their knees shooting to see the dust fly. Wisenberg finished shooting and Wichser had shot five times when Wisenberg told him he had emptied the weapon. Both arose to their feet and stood facing each other when Wichser snapped the supposedly empty weapon, the bullet hitting Wisenberg in the left side. He said he was getting dizzy, and laying down in the shade of a tree, died in a few minutes. The examining physician said the bullet had probably gone through the heart. The coroner's jury rendered a verdict of accidental shooting. Wisenberg was 20 years old.
