FINAL RITES FOR MRS. C. WITTWER HELD YESTERDAY

Passes Away in Home On Railroad Avenue Sunday A. M.

Following an illness which had its inception during the latter part of June, Mrs. Chloe Wittwer, 74 years of age, residing on Railroad avenue, passed away in her home here at 9:40 Sunday morning. The direct cause of her death was acute myocarditis, while pernicious anemia was contributory.

Born in Sylvester township, southeast of Monticello, Chloe Babler was a daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. Ezra Babler. On March 29, 1894, she was united in marriage in Monticello to Sam B. Wittwer, who for a long term of years was employed by the Karlen & Steinman Lumber company here. Mr. Wittwer died a few years ago. Of a quiet and unassuming disposition, Mrs. Wittwer was a woman of many sterling traits. She was a great home lover, deriving much enjoyment from her domestic surroundings. Mrs. Wittwer was affiliated with the local Reformed church.

Survivors are four sisters, Mrs. Mary Hess, Chehalis, Wash.; Mrs. Christ Bontly, Madison; Mrs. Celia Bontly, Monticello; and Miss Fannie Babler, also of this village.

Funeral services were conducted at 1:30 yesterday afternoon in the home and at 2 in the Reformed church with Rev. A. Muehlmeier in charge. Interment was in Highland cemetery.
