Mrs. Harriet Wittwer, 84 Former Resident Of Monticello, Dies

Funeral services for Mrs. Harriet Wittwer, 84 years of age, a former Monticello resident, who died at 2 a. m. Thursday of old age complications, were held at 2 Sunday afternoon at the Voegeli funeral home here.

The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, pastor of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, officiated, and interment was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were Carl Dick, Wilbert Dick and C. W. Karlen, Monticello, Charles Farmilow, John Sammis and Gordon Schmidt, Madison.

Mrs. Wittwer, who had been in failing health for several months, passed away at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Ernestine M. Jones, Kansas City, Mo.

Harriet Reese was born in Thomastown, Ohio, the daughter of John and Mary Thomas Reese. On Jan. 29, 1908, she was united in marriage at Redfield, S. D., to Ernest M. Wittwer. They resided in South Dakota for nine years and in 1917 moved to Madison, where they operated a tea room and restaurant. In 1940 they moved to Monticello, where Mr. Wittwer operated a cheese store. He had also been employed in cheese warehouses here prior to that time.

Mr. Wittwer passed away Jan. 13, 1961, and she had since made her home in Kansas City with her daughter.

Mrs. Wittwer was a member of the Monticello chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star.

Besides the daughter she is survived by two sons, George E., Madison, Jack, Atlantic City, N. J.; seven grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren; and two sisters, Mrs. Ida Schmidt and Mrs. Edith Edgerton, Los Angeles; Calif.
