Mrs. Rosina Wittwer, 90, Monticello Area Native, Succumbs

Funeral services for Mrs. Rosina Wittwer, 90 years of age. Madison, a former resident of Monticello and native of Washington township, who died last Wednesday, were held Saturday afternoon in the Memorial Evangelical and Reformed church in Madison, with the Rev. William Schultz officiating.

Burial was in Highland cemetery, Monticello.

Mrs. Wittwer had been hospitalized for two and one-half weeks and succumbed to a heart condition and old age complications.

Rose Dick was born on the present Ed. C. Hefty farm, Washington township. She was married to Samuel Wittwer, and the couple resided in Monticello for many years before moving to Madison 38 years ago. Mr. Wittwer at one time served as janitor in the Monticello schools and was in the building business in Madison for some time after the couple moved to the capital city.

For many years she had conducted a rooming house with her daughter, Mrs. Florence Babler.

Surviving are three daughters, Mrs. Florence Babler, Madison, Mrs. Ray (Salina) Alexander, Hayward, and Mrs. G. H. (Selma) Dougherty, Quincy, Ill; three sisters, Mrs. Anna Klossnes and Mrs. Louise Staedtler, Madison, and Mrs. Minnie Marty, Los Angeles, Calif.; seven grandchildren and eight great grand-children.

Mrs. Wittwer was a sister of the late John Dick, Monticello.
