O. E. Zentner, Aged 64, Dies Suddenly From Heart Attack
Mt. Pleasant Twp. Native Dies while Butchering; Services Today

Oswald E. Zentner, 64 years of age, Monroe, and a native of the Monticello vicinity, died very suddenly at 11 o'clock Tuesday morning while assisting with butchering on the Alfred Meier farm in Sylvester township, east of Monroe.

Death came as the result of a heart attack.

Mt. Pleasant Native

Mr. Zentner was a native of Mt. Pleasant township and was born April 23, 1886, the son of Oswald and Euphemia Stauffacher Zentner. He attended Zentner rural school, located short distance from his home. On Jan. 12, 1909, he was united in marriage to Edith Bontly, the ceremony taking place in Monticello. They always farmed on the Zentner homestead farm in Mt. Pleasant township, until retiring in 1941, at which time they moved to Monroe to make their home.

Mr. Zentner was a member of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church while they resided near Monticello.

He is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Leroy Holcomb, Rockford, Ill., and Mrs. Marcel Wuilleumier, Richland Center; two brothers, Dick L. Zentner, Monticello, and Dr. John P. Zentner, Milwaukee; and three grandchildren. He was preceded in death by a sister, Mrs. J. M. Freitag, in 1938.

Funeral Thursday

Funeral services will be held at 2 this (Thursday) afternoon in the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church. The Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, church pastor, will officiate, and burial will be in Highland cemetery.
