

Clarence E. Zimmerman

Nov. 18, 1899 - Oct. 3, 1984

Clarence E. Zimmerman, 84, Riverview Apartments, Albany, died at 2:30 p.m. Wednesday Oct. 3, 1984, at his residence.

He was born on the Zimmerman homestead farm in Washington Township, Green County, Nov. 18, 1899, the son of Albert and Anna (Blumer) Zimmerman. He attended the Purcell rural school.

Mr. Zimmerman farmed in Washington Township until January of 1942 when he moved to Monroe and was employed at the City Gas Plant for 15 years. He then moved to Brodhead, working for 10 years for Capitol Plastics. He retired in 1974.

Surviving are a son, Sheldon C. Zimmerman; a daughter, Mrs. Richard (Annette) Markham, both of Brodhead; three brothers, Albert Zimmerman Jr., New Glarus, and Amos and Harold of Monticello; four sisters, Mrs. Clara Weissmiller, at the New Glarus Home; Mrs. Mildred Williams, of Pleasant View Nursing Home; Mrs. Hilda Loveland and Mrs. Ivan (Leona) Marty, both of Monticello; 10 grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by a son, Myles, declared dead in 1953 following the Korean Conflict; a sister, Mrs. Edna Schuler, 1966, and a brother, Amos, 1982.

He was confirmed in the Washington Reformation Church and was a member of Zwingli United Church of Christ.

Funeral was held Saturday in Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello. The Rev. John Van Blarcom, interim pastor officiated. Burial was in Highland Cemetery, Monticello.

Voegeli Funeral Service was in charge of arrangements.
