

**Fred J. Zurfluh**  
**Feb. 18, 1912 – May 8, 1973**

Fred J. Zurfluh, 61, Monticello, died unexpectedly about 1 a.m. today in his home from a massive heart attack.

He was a retired farmer and had lived in the village since 1967.

He was born in Jordan Township, Green County, Feb. 18, 1912, a son of John and Elsie Legler Zurfluh. The family moved to Mt. Pleasant Township, between Monticello and Albany, in 1916 and he attended Fairview rural school. On Nov. 18, 1937, he married Wilma K. Spring in Monticello. They then farmed in Mt. Pleasant Township.

Surviving Mr. Zurfluh are his widow, Wilma; three sons, Frederick J., Rt. 1, Albany; Roger R., Rt. 1, Monticello, and William N., Rt. 1, Brooklyn; two daughters, Mrs. William (Jeanette) Minch, Comstock Park; Mich., and Mrs. John (Juanita) Hefty, Platteville; three brothers, John M., Rt. 1, Albany; Willis, Monroe, and Robert, Seattle, Wash.; three sisters, Mrs. Henry E. (Lena) Spring, Rt. 1, Monticello; Mrs. Fred (Lillian). Beer Jr., Monroe, and Mrs. Charles (Rosella) Briggs, Albany, and 12 grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by a son, Neil, at the age of three, Sept. 1, 1945; a brother, Louis, Sept. 6, 1960; a sister, Mrs. John (Clara) Robinson, in Missouri in August 1967; his father, Jan. 13, 1958, and his mother, Oct. 29, 1966.

Funeral services will be at 1:30 p.m. Thursday, May 10, in Zwingli United Church of Christ at Monticello. Rev. Charles G. Workman is to officiate. Burial will be there in Highland Cemetery.
