Fred K. Zweifel, 63, Esteemed. Resident of Exeter Twp. Dies Extended Illness Fatal to Native of County; Rites Planned Here Friday

Fred K. Zweifel, 63 years of age, esteemed Exeter township farmer and well known in Monticello and the northern section of Green county, passed away at his farm home at 6 o'clock Tuesday evening after an illness of two months' duration.

The body is at the Voegeli funeral home. At noon Friday it will be removed to the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church.

Mr. Zweifel was born in New Glarus township Aug. 1, 1882, the son of Peter and Barbara Zweifel. He attended the Legler rural school in New Glarus township and later attended the New Glarus high school. On Dec. 17, 1903, he was united in marriage to Barbara Klassy, the ceremony taking place in New Glarus. The couple farmed on the Zweifel homestead farm for nine years and in 1912 they moved to their present farm in Exeter township.

Mr. Zweifel, a prosperous and industrious farmer, was a member of the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church, Monticello.

Surviving, besides the bereaved widow, are seven sons, Fred Jr., and Herman, Belleville, Ivan, New Glarus, Gilbert, Albany, Alvin, Brooklyn, and Clarence and Walter, at home; two daughters, Mrs. Fred Winiger, Milwaukee, and Mrs. Sam Crooks, Brodhead, and 24 grandchildren,

Besides his parents, Mr. Zweifel was preceded in death by a son in infancy, one sister, Mrs. Math. Schmid, and three brothers, Jacob, Albert and Henry.

Funeral services will be held at 2, Friday afternoon at the Zwingli Evangelical and Reformed church, Monticello. The Rev. A. R. Achtemeier, church pastor, will officiate, and burial will be in Highland cemetery.
