Miss Regula Zweifel Dies at Waterville, New York

Many readers of the Messenger will be pained to learn of the sorrow that has come to Mr. and Mrs. Fred Zweifel, Waterville, New York, in the recent death of their daughter, Miss Regula Zweifel, the news of which was received by Monticello relatives a few days ago. Mr. and Mrs. Zweifel are former residents of Monticello and New Glarus, and prior to their removal to New York state Mr. Zweifel owned and conducted a farm in the vicinity of Belleville for a number of years. The deceased was a granddaughter of Mrs. Regula Zweifel and a niece of Mrs. Henry Voegeli, who live a short distance north of Monticello. The following obituary is taken in the Waterville (New York) News:

A beautiful young life was brought to a close early Monday morning, March 13th, when Miss Regula Zweifel passed away at the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Zweifel, where she had been ill for about a year during which time her sufferings had been borne with true Christian fortitude.

Miss Zweifel was born in Monticello, Wis., May 22, 1888, coming to this village with her parents in 1914. For a short time they resided in the village, later moving onto a farm a short distance out. During her short residence here she made many friends who are a deeply saddened by her removal from their midst. She was an unusually bright and attractive young woman and her life had every promise of a successful and beautiful future until her health failed.

At New Glarus, Wis., she was confirmed in the Reformed church. She attended the National Training School for Nurses, graduating in 1916. Since that time she has, in many homes in this vicinity, shown her skill and ability and endeared herself to many.

Mr. and Mrs. Zweifel, who are grief stricken, have the sympathy of the entire community in their loss. There are also four sisters and two brothers who are sorrowing the loss of a much beloved sister, Miss Barbara and Helena, at home, Mrs. M. J. Conley of Mt. Upton, Mrs. Francis Alsheimer, John and Fred of this village.

Funeral services were held at her home on Wednesday afternoon at 2 o'clock, Rev. A. W. Allen officiating, Amidst beautiful flowers, tributes from friends and relatives, she was laid to rest in the Waterville cemetery.
