**Final Rites Con Conducted for Mt. Pleasant Twp. Native**

An item of more than passing interest to residents of Monticello, which was unintentionally omitted from the columns of The Messenger, was the passing away on Friday, Feb. 25, of Mrs. Adeline Magoon Zwickey, aged 75, who passed away at the home of her son, O. O. Zwickey, near Basco, Wis. She had been ailing for some time.

Adeline Magoon was the daughter of Richard and Mary Magoon and was born in Mt. Pleasant township. She received her early education in the "Little Red School house" and later lived in and near Monticello. On April 1, 1882, she was united in marriage to Henry Zwickey, Monticello. To this union were born four children, two daughters passing away in early infancy. Her husband passed away May 16, 1915, and was laid to rest in Railroad avenue cemetery, Since 1916 Mrs. Zwickey had made her home with her son at Basco.

Mrs. Zwickey was one of 12 children and her parents were pioneer residents of the Monticello community. When she was only two years old she was faced with the sorrowful task of carrying on without the presence of her father, who gave his life while fighting with the Union forces during the Civil war.

Survivors are one son, O. O. Zwickey, Basco; a sister, Mrs. Sadie Chandler, St. Paul, Minn.; three grandchildren, Ward and Jared Zwickey, Madison, and Mary Zwickey, Basco.

She was preceded in death by a son, R. H. Zwickey, who passed away in 1931 while in the service of the department of justice in the city of Madison.

She was a sister-in-law of R. J. Edwards, and an aunt of R. H. Schoonover, both of this village.

Funeral services were held in the Zwickey home in Basco Sunday, Feb. 27, the Rev. Carl Flueckinger, pastor of the Belleville Reformed church, officiating. Interment was in the Railroad avenue cemetery, Monticello.
