

DONALD M. FLANNERY

Donald M. Flannery, 71, Kennewick, WA., formerly of Monticello, suffered an unexpected heart attack and died May 21, 1999 following surgery at Deaconess Medical Center, Spokane, WA.

He was born July 20, 1927, the son of Dennis and Erma (Hanson) Flannery of Argyle. On Dec. 30, 1950 he married Marion Helmeid; she died March 3, 1959. On Aug. 25, 1960 he married De Lea Treloar at the Little Brown Church, Nashua, IA. He lived his entire life in southern Wisconsin until retiring from Chalet Cheese Co-op in June 1998, when they moved to Kennewick.

He earned his private pilot's license in October, 1973 and was a member of the Civil Air Patrol; past commander of American Legion Post #141, New Glarus; member of 40 & 8; and served in the army in Germany during the Korean Conflict.
