

Mrs. Otto Freitag, 27 Years of Age, Is Called By Death

Funeral Services Held On Tuesday For Native of Monticello

Funeral services for Mrs. Otto Freitag, 27 years of age, New Glarus, a native of Monticello, whose sudden and unexpected death occurred at 9 o'clock Saturday evening in a Madison hospital, were conducted at 1:30 Tuesday afternoon in the home and at 2 in the Reformed church.

The services were in charge of Rev. A. Muehlmeier, pastor of the church. Interment was in Highland cemetery.

Complications were responsible for the death of Mrs. Blum, who became the mother of a son 10 days prior to her passing. She was removed to the Madison hospital when her condition became critical and her death occurred only a few hours later.

Born in Monticello

Born in Monticello Feb. 5, 1907, Alta Blum was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Casper Blum. She was a graduate of the Monticello high school, having received her diploma with the class of 1925. After attending the Whitewater State Teachers College for the next two years, she engaged in teaching. Her marriage to Otto Freitag, formerly of Monticello, was an event which transpired June 27, 1929, in Dubuque, Iowa.

Member of Eastern Star

Mrs. Freitag was confirmed in the Reformed church here in 1923. She was affiliated with the Eastern Star lodge of Monticello.

The tragic passing of Mrs. Freitag at such an early stage and at a time when her children are in need of a mother's tender care has brought grief and sorrow, not only to immediate relatives but to the community in general. Mrs. Freitag was a woman who always had a cheery "hello" for everyone she met and her pleasant personality and kind disposition were only a few of the outstanding traits that made her popular with a large number of friends and acquaintances.

Besides the widower, Mrs. Freitag is survived by two sons, Keith Allan, aged 4, and Ronald Stanley, 10 days old, and her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Casper Blum.
