Fred Rolph died as result of injuries

Fred Rolph, 48, Monticello, died suddenly Tuesday evening at the Deaconess Hospital at Monroe, where he had been cared for since he was injured several weeks ago. Although he suffered a broken leg, a dislocated shoulder and several bruises, he was progressing rapidly and his recovery seemed almost certain, a blood clot proved fatal.

He was injured while working on the New Glarus-Postville road, west of Bloomers near the Ray Hauser farm, where he was employed as check up man for the Ryan Construction Co. He had slipped from the running board of a truck and was run over by another truck.

Mr. Rolph was married on Feb. 23, 1905, in Freeport, to Miss Elizabeth Hoesly, New Glarus. They lived here (New Glarus) for several years where he was employed at the mill. They also had a farm east of Monticello. They have lived at Monticello for about 18 years. He is survived by his wife, 4 brothers, Charles, George, Hiram and John; 4 sisters, Mrs. Aug. Ruegg, Mrs. Lottie Klassy, Mrs. Soper and Mrs. Pierce. Funeral services will be conducted at the Reformed Church at Monticello, on Friday afternoon.

Fred was an expert carpenter. A good honest hard-working man, he built his own home in Monticello, a big white house at the end of the block, south from the Church house. (231 South Garfield St.)
