

## **Rites Held Here for Herman J Schlittler, Heart Attack Victim**

Pallbearers for Herman J. Schlittler, 57 years of age, prominent Monticello business man, who died suddenly at about 10 p. m. Sunday, Oct. 3, 1965, at his home here of an apparent heart attack, were: Karl H. Freitag, John Zuber, Merlyn Loveland, Zane Zurbuchen, Robert Schlittler and Robert Zweifel.

Services were conducted at 2 Wednesday afternoon, Oct. 6, in the Zwingli United Church of Christ. The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, church pastor, officiated, and burial was in Highland cemetery. Masonic services were conducted at the Voegeli funeral home on Tuesday evening.

He was born on a farm in Mt. Pleasant township, Aug. 14, 1908, the son of Edward and Susanna Elmer Schlittler. He attended the Monticello schools and was married on Oct. 20, 1943, to Mrs. Helen Wyss, who died in 1953.

In 1961, he was married to Mrs. Orpha Kubly. He operated a trucking business in Monticello for a number of years and in 1948 he purchased the D-X service station and tire business from Emil G. Voegeli here, which he was operating at the time of his death.

He is survived by his wife: five step-children, Mrs. William Brecklin, Mukwonago, Mrs. William Hogan, Blanchardville, Airman Second Class Irving J. Kubly, Omaha, Neb.. Carl o. Wyss Janesville, and Mrs. Aline Loeffel Monticello; one brother, Carl E Schlittler, Monticello, and one sister, Mrs. Edward J. Marty, Monticello, and eight step-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his first wife on Jan. 3. 1953, his parents, a brother, Walter H. Schlittler, and one sister, Barbara, in infancy.

Mr. Schlittler was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello Masonic Lodge 155, and the Order of the Eastern Star.
