

D. D. Stauffacher Passes in Madison

Final Rites Conducted for Mt. Pleasant Twp. Native

Dietrich D. Stauffacher, 75 years of age, a life long resident of Green county and for 36 years a resident of Monroe, passed away early Monday morning in a Madison hospital, where he had been confined for several months.

Native of Mt. Pleasant

Mr. Stauffacher was a native of Mt. Pleasant township, having been born July 5, 1862, the son of Dietrich and Anna Norder Stauffacher. On Feb. 19, 1888, he was united in marriage to Anno Knipschild. For some years following their marriage the couple followed the farming profession. In 1901 the couple moved to Monroe to make their home. Mrs. Stauffacher passed away June 26, 1918.

Surviving are one daughter, Miss Anna L. Stauffacher, who made her home with him; four sisters, Mesdames M a t t Geigel, Jacob Geigel, Fred Marty and Katherine Herr, all of Monroe; and five brothers, Nic and Matt, Mt. Pleasant township, Jacob, Renwick, Iowa, Leonard, Fennimore, and John, Monroe. A sister, Mrs. Fred Kundert, Monticello, passed away in 1906, and a brother, Edward, passed away in Freeport in 1936.

Mr. Stauffacher was well known to many readers of The Messenger and news of his sudden death comes as a sad blow, many of whom did not realize that Mr. Stauffacher's condition was so serious. He had always been held in high esteem by the large number of friends whom he numbered among his acquaintances.

Funeral services will be held at 2 this (Thursday) afternoon in the Shriner-Neushwander f u n e r a l home, Monroe. Rev. George R. Keepin, pastor of the Methodist church, will officiate. Interment will be in Greenwood cemetery.
