

BALTZ VOEGELI, 65, DIES AT MONTICELLO
COMPLICATIONS FOR NERVOUS BREAKDOWN FATAL LAST NIGHT
1865 - 1931

Monticello - A nervous breakdown, followed by complications, proved fatal to Baltz Voegeli, aged 65, at midnight Friday in his Monticello home. He had been ailing since Nov. 9.

Mr. Voegeli was a lifelong resident of Green county, having been born at the old Voegeli homestead in Washington township May 1, 1865. He was the son of Joseph and Barbara Voegeli. On Feb. 17, 1885 he was married at New Glarus to Miss Rose Figi. They lived on farms in New Glarus and Monticello vicinity, and in Washington township. Since 1913 they had lived in Monticello.

Surviving are the widow; five sons, John, Cedar Rapids; Alfred B., Monroe merchant; Leon and Emil, Monticello, and Edward, Chicago; four brothers, Joseph, Belleville; Will and Emil, Monticello; Albert, Monroe vicinity; three sisters, Mrs. Regula Hefty, Valley Falls, Kan.; Mrs. Edward Zwickey, New Glarus, and Mrs. John Wittenwyler, Sr., Monticello; and six grandchildren. A daughter, Alice, preceded him in death.

Mr. Voegeli was a member of the Reformed church of Monticello and the G. U. G. Germania lodge of Monroe.

Interment was in the Highland Cemetery, Monticello.
