

## **Mrs. Emma. Voegeli Succumbs; Services Held Here Sunday**

Funeral services for Mrs. Leon A. Voegeli, 79 years of age, a resident of Monticello for many years, who died at 6:40 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 22, at the Madison General hospital, were held at .2 Sunday afternoon at the Zwingli United Church of Christ here.

The Rev. J. Allan Mittler, church pastor, officiated, and interment was in Highland cemetery. Pallbearers were Fred Abbott, Thomas Brusveen, Walter Haddinger, Wilbert E. Stauffer, Herman E. Voegeli and Jacob A. Voegeli.

Mrs. Voegeli, who had been a resident of the Four Winds Mangor nursing home, Verona, for the past four years, had been a ipatient in the hospital since Dec. 31. She submitted to surgery there on Jan. 6 and had apparently been progressing well when death came suddenly and unexpectedly.

Emma O. Zimmerman was born in New Glarus on Oct. 24, 1890, a daughter of Thomas and Susanna Elmer Zimmerman. Prior to her marriage she taught rural schools and was a bookkeeper for S. J. Luchsinger in his implement shop here. On Sept. 22, 1921, she was united in marriage to Leon A. Voegeli, in Monticello by the late Rev. A. Muehlmeier.

Mrs. Voegeli was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ and its Ladies Aid Society.

She is survived by her husband; one daughter, Mrs. John Stenbrotten, Monticello; one sister, Mrs. Fred (Marie) Hadinger, Fort Atkinson; and four grandsons, John A., James, Steven and Daniel Stenbrotten.

She was preceded in death by a brother, Gabriel; four sisters, Katharine, Mrs. Henry E. (Rose) Babler, Mrs. Charles (Anna) Eckburg, Plymouth, Mrs. Henry C. (Susan) Elmer, and one granddaughter, Deanne Kay Stenbrotten, June 26, 1947.
