

## **ANNA WITTENWYLER**

Mrs. Anna Wittenwyler, 84, Monticello, Green County native, passed away in St. Clare Hospital August 27th, 1975, at 10:45 p.m. She had been in failing health for several months.

Mrs. Wittenwyler, born in Mt. Pleasant Township on November 9, 1890, was the former Anna Regula Kubly. Her parents were Abraham and Maria Baebler Kubly. She attended the Silver rural school. She was married February 20, 1908, at Monticello by the late Rev. Carl Hyle to Matt H. Wittenwyler.

After their marriage they farmed in Washington Township for two years and in 1910 moved to Mt. Pleasant Township where they farmed for 38 years. They retired to Monticello in 1947. Mr. and Mrs. Wittenwyler observed their 65th wedding anniversary February 20, 1973.

She took pride in her gardening and worked in her flower garden before ill health kept her from doing this kind of work. She enjoyed reading, knitting and crocheting and all kinds of handiwork.

Surviving are a daughter, Mrs. Bernie (Mary Ann) Wilde; New Glarus, and a son, Clarence Wittenwyler, Monticello; two sisters, Mrs. Marion (Ida) Swann, rural Albany; Mrs. Walter (Lydia) Wittenwyler, Monticello; four grandchildren and seven great-grandchildren.

She was preceded in death by her husband on June 27, 1973; five brothers, Henry, Conrad, John, Abraham Jr., and Daniel; and a sister, Mrs. Henry (Mary) Dooley.

She was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, in Monticello, the Ladies Aid Society, the John Ross Relief Corps and Royal Neighbors of America.

Funeral services were held Saturday, August 30, at 1:30 p.m. in the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello. Rev. Charles G. Workman officiated. Interment was in Highland Cemetery, Monticello.
