

MRS. IDA (R.W.) WOELFFER, SR.

The funeral for Mrs. Ida Woelffer, Sr., 79, Monticello, who died unexpectedly Tuesday, Sept. 14, 1976, was held Friday, Sept. 17, in the Zwingli United Church of Christ, with Rev. Charles G. Workman officiating. Burial was in Highland Cemetery.

Mrs. Woelffer, well-known wife of Monticello druggist R. W. Woelffer, Sr., and mother of druggist Royal, Jr., died of an apparent heart attack.

She was born in Milwaukee on May 2, 1897, the daughter of Charles H. and Regula Zentner Bindschaedler. The former Ida Bindschaedler graduated from Monroe High School in 1917. She was married to Royal W. Woelffer, Sr., on Jan. 15, 1918, at the home of her parents in Monroe. They resided in Monticello ever since their marriage.

She is survived by her husband, Roy; a son, Royal, Jr., Monticello; a daughter, Mrs. Edward (Betty Jane) Kaelin, St. Charles, Ill.; a sister, Miss Hannah Bindschaedler, Monroe; and three grandchildren.

Preceding her in death were her parents and a sister, Mrs. William (Tillie) Greub, in 1973. Mrs. Woelffer was a member of the Zwingli United Church of Christ, Monticello, the Little Missionary Society, a charter member of the Amstutz-Marty American Legion Post Auxiliary and a member and former officer of the Wisconsin Pharmaceutical Association Auxiliary.
