

## **Dwight H Zimmerman**

**May 9, 1929 - March 1, 1994**

MONTICELLO - Dwight H. Zimmerman, age 64, of rural Monticello, passed away on Tuesday afternoon, March 1, 1994 at the University Hospital-Madison after a short illness. He was born in Green County on May 9, 1929. He was a graduate of Monticello High School in 1947 and was married on October 15, 1955 to Mary Ann Schmitz in Monroe.

Mr. Zimmerman was a dairy farmer all his life, and farmed in Exeter Township since 1957. He was a member of Saint Victor's Church and a member of the Knights of Columbus, Monroe. He is a member and former president of the Monticello Lion's Club and also former director of the Monticello Northside Cheese Factory and served one term as a director of the Little Sugar Watershed. He was a lifetime member and director for the Green County Farm Bureau.
